With eye on revenue, Panvel bats for clean-up marshals

They will also assist civic body in taking action against single-use of plastic; collecting fines for not wearing masks, spitting and open defecation

On the lines of the BMC, the Panvel Municipal Corporation (PMC) has appointed an agency to provide clean-up marshals across the city. These marshals will ensure cleanliness of the city and collect fines from people littering. They will also assist the civic body in taking action against single-use of plastic.

While clearing the proposal, the civic chief said it will help make the city cleaner and create a sense of responsibility among residents.

As per the proposal cleared by the standing committee, a fine of Rs 150 will be collected for littering on public roads, and Rs 100 for open urination. Similarly, clean-up marshals will collect Rs 500 for open defecation, and Rs 100 for spitting.

lishment is found with the banned single-use plastic, clean-up marshals, along with civic officials, will collect Rs 5,000 for the first offence, Rs 10,000 for the second one, and Rs 25,000 for the third offence.

As segregation of waste is important to ensure less waste reaches dumping grounds, Rs 50 will be collected if waste is not segregated for the first time and Rs 100 for the second time. If the

same person does not segregate the waste, s/he will have to pay a fine of Rs 150.

Like Mumbai, marshals will collect Rs 200 from people for not wearing masks and Rs 1,000 for spitting in the public and in crowded areas.

However, the majority of the residents echoed that the civic body should first provide a sufficient number of public toilets to prevent people from urinating in open spaces.

Short film, jingle competition on cleanliness in Navi Mumbai

To rank top in the cleanliness survey 2022, the Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation (NMMC) is emphasising citizens' participation, and will hold a short film and jingle competition on 'Reduce, Reuse, Recycle' to promote hygiene among youths. The film must be shot only in the NMMC area and its duration should be 2-5 minutes along with the nomenclature.

Top three short films will be awarded Rs 25,000, Rs 15,000 and Rs 10,000 as awards, respectively. The deadline to participate in the competition is 12 pm on December 27 and the screening of the short film will be held on December 30.

A senior civic official said drawing and street drama competitions have already been conducted. "Now, this competition will be organised to stress on participation from youth in creating awareness about hygiene," he said.

The jingle competition is also being organised to provide a platform for artists working in the field of song and music. Based on the theme 'Clean, Beautiful Navi Mumbai', jingles of duration 1-3 minutes in Marathi language will be presented in the MP3 format with the slogan 'Nishchay Kela-Number One'. The best three jingles will be awarded Rs 15,000, Rs 10,000 and Rs 7,000 as prizes.

Three held for dummy selling on OLX, duping man of Rs 27,000

The Malabar Hill police have arrested three persons from Surat for cheating a south Mumbai resident to the tune of Rs 26,999. The police said the accused habitually put up advertisements on OLX and take cash from victims without supplying products.

The police said the complainant in this case saw a bicycle on an online shopping portal and sent a message on the number provided. After the initial exchange, when he paid Rs 26,999 for it, he saw the advertisement had been removed from the page and the seller had stopped responding. He then approached the police to register a case.

Looking for the WhatsApp number used by the accused, the police found that it was registered in the name of a deceased person. A team headed by assistant police inspector Tukaram Dighe, along with the cyber staff, reached Surat on December 20. Through technical details, the team nabbed one Shani Kumar

Pravin Bhai Sheladiya, 26, and found that 10 SIM cards from different telecom firms were being used for such frauds. Sheladiya led the police to Sunil Bharat Bhai Waghsiya, 27, who provided him with SIM cards, and Yagnil Jayanti bhai Panseriya, 28, who activated them. On further search, the police found 320 dummy SIM cards from them. They also seized a laptop, seven mobile phones and six bank cheque books.

Senior police inspector Suryakant Bangar said the accused were using OLX platform for advertising products with their WhatsApp number. After talking on the phone, they used to share a Paytm number to forward the cash, but blocked the buyer's number after receiving the money.

Water pumping firm calls out ex-employees for data theft

A submersible dewatering pump company has lodged a case against three former employees, alleging data theft. The company in its complaint has alleged that the employees allegedly stole design data information after resigning. It is said that they started their own firm and began dealing in their product.

The Shivaji Nagar police in Thane said the complainant is executive assistant to the president of the company. Last year, between October and December, three senior employees of the company had resigned. In January, this year, they floated a company with allegedly the same product. The complainant has alleged that they got unauthorised access to design photographs and used them for their own company. "Statements of all persons contacted with the case will be recorded in due course of time and necessary documents and digital records will be collected to ascertain what actually transpired.

Stung by the accusations of causing injuries to snakes during the rescue operations, the fire and emergency wing of the Mira Bhayandar Municipal Corporation (MBMC) has asked citizens to contact the control room of the forest ranger (Mumbai) on 8104926313 or dial 2x7 toll

The civic body has said people can lodge complaints or get information about a variety of issues related to forests and wildlife on the same helpline number. In response to the accusations related to attending calls and catching wild animals without permission,

MBMC through a release has asked the citizens to directly approach the forest rangers officer on the given helpline numbers

MBMC deputy commissioner Maruti Gaikwad has

dashed off a letter to the forest department directing it that henceforth the fire brigade personnel will not entertain the calls and instead pass the information to the ranger's office about any calls related to spotting of wild animals like snakes or monkeys in the twin-city.

However, apart from raising concerns over the safety of snakes due to injuries

caused by putting them in a single box, the contents of the letter by the forest ranger directs MBMC's fire brigade to inform them before carrying out any rescue operations.

The MBMC through a press release has asked the citizens to directly approach the office of range forest rangers officer on the above given helpline numbers.
